The TRICUD Final International Conference aims at presenting the main findings of the multidisciplinary research programme TRICUD (2010-2014) on post-migratory cities and transnational flows, the dynamics of identities and the process of cultural diversification. TRICUD aims to better understand how migration transforms both sending societies in the South and receiving societies in the North. The conference will include keynote speakers Nina GLICK-SCHILLER (University of Manchester) and Steve VERTOVEC (University of Oxford and Max Planck Institute). The conference will also open the discussion on Transnational Families and Caregiving Practices (session 1), Trans-locality: Anchor, Mobilities and Belongings Recomposition (session 2), Cultural diversity and inter-ethnic relations in European societies (session 3) and Artistic Expression and Identity Construction in Multicultural Cities (session 4).
